## RECTOR'S ORDER NO. 9

of 23 February 2021

on the amount of fees for educational services provided at the first and second cycle degree studies for students who have started or resumed studies in the academic year 2021/2022 at SGH Warsaw School of Economics

Pursuant to Article 23 par. 2 point 10, in conjunction with Article 79 par. 1 and Article 80 par. 2 of the Act of 20 July 2018 – the Law on Higher Education and Science (Journal of Laws of 2020, item 85, as amended)<sup>1</sup>, it is hereby ordered as follows:

### § 1

From students of the first and second cycle degree studies at SGH Warsaw School of Economics, hereinafter referred to as “SGH Warsaw School of Economics” or “the University”, the fees for educational services referred to in Article 79 par. 1 of the Act – the Law on Higher Education and Science, hereinafter referred to as “the Act”, are collected in the amount stipulated in the appendix to the Order.

### § 2

1. Fees are paid to the relevant, individual account of the student indicated in the USOSweb system and kept on the bank account of SGH Warsaw School of Economics.
2. Tuition for the winter semester is due until 30 September, and for summer semester until the last day of February.
3. In the case of instalment payment, instalments are due until the last day of each month starting from September in the winter semester and February in the summer semester.

4. The detailed terms and conditions of paying fees are stipulated in the agreement concluded between SGH Warsaw School of Economics and the student.
5. Statutory interests due to a delay are charged on fees paid upon the lapse of the deadline. In case a student is in arrears with payments for a period longer than three months, he or she is deleted from the list of students. The date of fee payment is the date of crediting the amount due on the University's account.
6. In the case of deleting from the list of students due to the non-payment of fees related to studies, it is possible to be entered into the list of students again upon settlement of all amounts due to the University.

### § 3

1. The Student pays tuition for the second and another faculties at part-time studies in Polish or full-time studies in English, in compliance with the table of fees.
2. In the case of declaring in the semester a number of ECTS smaller than the number required by the Rules and Regulations of the first and second cycle degree studies at SGH Warsaw School of Economics due to considering certain subjects as passed, the student may apply for return of the relevant part of tuition.

### § 4

1. Students are provided with the limit of ECTS points in the number necessary to graduate from a given level of education (basic limit) and additionally 6 ECTS points to be used for additional subjects (additional limit).
2. ECTS points obtained by students for classes at other universities and transferred to the curriculum at the SGH Warsaw School of Economics pursuant to Article 85 par. 1 point 1 of the Act, including those resulting from the Learning agreement, are taken into account as the execution of the basic limit, but are not treated as exceeding it also in the case of obtaining, as a result of transferring, the number of ECTS points larger than this limit. In this case the student still has the additional limit to use for classes not covered with the basic curriculum.
3. ECTS obtained by SGH Warsaw School of Economics' students from interdisciplinary specialisation subjects organised on the grounds of an agreement concluded by SGH Warsaw School of Economics with an international partner, if this specialisation is selected by the student as the first interdisciplinary specialisation, are taken into account as execution of the basic limit (in the case the taken subjects constitute a part of the basic curriculum) or the additional limit (in the case the taken subjects are not covered with the basic curriculum),

respectively, yet, it is not treated as exceeding the said limits. The student may, without paying for classes not covered with the curriculum, complete one interdisciplinary specialisation referred to in the previous sentence. The interdisciplinary specialisation, for which no payment is made, is selected by the student.

4. ECTS points obtained by SGH Warsaw School of Economics' students from basic curriculum subjects within the double degree programme are taken into account as the achievement of the basic limit and in the case of taking subjects not covered with the basic curriculum, also the additional limit, yet, it is not treated as exceeding the said limits.

#### § 5

The order enters into force as on the day of signing and applies to students who have started or resumed studies in the academic year 2021/2022.
